FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

Dear MVEDA Stakeholders:

At MVEDA, we always attempt to provide an honest assessment of the economic development climate and to provide pragmatic advice on how to overcome the obstacles to job creation we are faced against. Overall, this was a challenging year for job creation and getting projects past the finish line. The combination of a long presidential election cycle and uncertainties with NAFTA slowed down much of the momentum we had gained over the past few years. However, our greatest challenge had to do with the lack of existing and available facility space that would fit the needs of our projects. In fact, 82% of all projects required existing facility space and would not consider a build-to-suit option. Although project closings were down from previous years, we did see an increase in our business development activity and project pipeline. The MVEDA staff continues to place more resources into marketing, reaching critical decision makers within our targeted industries, building private-public partnerships, and supporting the building blocks of economic development within the region. These efforts we feel will create new momentum and success entering the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year.

In summary, 258 jobs were announced this past fiscal year to which MVEDA directly contributed. Although this is a drop when we compare ourselves to prior years there is good news.



LEGISLATIVE SUCCESS

MVEDA believes a skilled, ready, and available workforce are critical to success of any economic development effort. In addition to education and training, talent recruitment is a necessary part of growing a successful business and entrepreneurial economy. Based on this premise, MVEDA worked on an effort to add enhancements to the State's Job Training Incentive Program to identify and support talent recruitment for hard to find skill sets and required experienced personnel that may not locally reside, especially in rural areas. Supported by the Association of Commerce & Industry (ACI), and carried by Representative McCamley and Senator Papen, HB 147 unanimously passed both the House and the Senate and was signed into law by Governor Martinez. As a client facing entity, MVEDA continuously seeks to identify competitive challenges to job creation and to work with its public and private sector partners to also identify solutions for creating a stronger economic development product offering.
